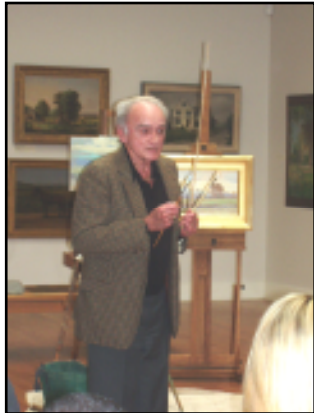


Programs at the Museum

Cape Cod Museum of Art is dedicated to preserving and exhibiting our rich artistic heritage, bringing art and culture into the lives of the entire community, and carrying the Cape's artistic spirit to future generations.



In addition to the array of changing exhibits displayed in the museum's seven galleries, there are gallery talks by featured artists, lectures by scholars, and a wide variety of art classes for children and adults in the Weny Education Center.

Each season of the year brings a new selection of art classes taught by experienced artists in four-to-eight week sessions, including painting classes in all mediums, sculpture, printmaking, drawing, enameling, stained glass and more. Workshops and demonstrations on pastels, plein air painting, archival matting of art work, and white line printmaking are recent offerings. An exciting selection of children's classes

covers everything from drawing, painting, multi-media and clay classes.

CCMA also hosts a number of special events each year including the annual Secret Garden Tour, Family Day and the Arts Auction. There are artist's receptions, lectures and concerts as well.

The Cape Cinema, the museum's neighbor on the grounds of the Cape Cod Center for the Arts, is renowned for showing outstanding independent, foreign language and art films from April - November. CCMA and the Cape Cinema now jointly operate the museum's 90-seat D'Alessandro Auditorium as a companion screen under the name, *The Screening Room*. Quality films continue on a daily schedule December - March in the museum's intimate setting, a forerunner in digital screening of first-run films.
