

ARTHUR V. DIEHL

This definitive biography of artist Arthur V. Diehl's life (1870-1929) and art was researched and written with love and determination over the course of 40 years by the artist's granddaughter, Eugenia Diehl Pell.

The beautifully bound, Smyth Sewn lay flat hard cover book includes 102 large, full color reproductions of Diehl's paintings interspersed in the 6 chronological chapters that follow his art career from England to Italy, Morocco and Holland to the United States- including New York and Boston, and later to Provincetown. He became a historically significant figure in the Provincetown art scene in the 1920s, painting and selling accurate depictions of the fishing industry, boats at sea, and wharfs.

A Classical Approach to Portrait and Figure Drawing with Paul Mohr

Working with instructor Paul Mohr, students gain a firm grounding in the mechanical 'nuts and bolts' of drawing, and just as important, the mental aspects of seeing, understanding, and interpreting how the light around us describes what we see. Students will also tour and discuss the exhibition with Paul, Showman with a Paintbrush: The Life and Art of Arthur V. Diehl.





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Arthur Vidal Diehl (1870-1929) is best-known as an artist who worked in Provincetown in the 1910s and 1920s. At a time when the art colony was in the thrall of impressionism and early modernism, he painted wharves, dunes and ocean waves-along with numerous other subjects—in a traditional style. He also broke with the norm in that he enjoyed having spectators in his studio while he painted. He'd regale onlookers with stories, impromptu art lessons and philosophical observations, all while completing a perfectly realized scene in 20 to 30 minutes, start to finish.

A profile on the artist, published in Success magazine in 1909, dubbed Diehl a "champion speed painter." Given his crowdpleasing demonstrations, some of his contemporaries thought of him as a showman, not a real artist. But his skill was no gimmick. He had abundant natural talent enhanced with European training; the self-cultivated habit of memorizing scenes; the ability to multitask; and time-saving painting techniques (such as picking up multiple colors or gradations of a color on his brush). He played by his own rules, producing strong, interesting, recognizable paintings.

This retrospective was curated by the artist's granddaughter, Eugenia "Genii" Diehl Pell, who has loved and lived with his paintings all her life. In 1996, her father, Arthur C. V. Diehl, put nearly two hundred of Diehl's paintings into her safekeeping, along with boxes of drawings, photographs, letters, unpublished manuscripts and newspaper articles. Recognizing she was in a better position than anyone to secure her grandfather's legacy, she has spent the past 28 years restoring his paintings and researching his life and career. Capping her efforts is the newly published monograph, Arthur V. Diehl, and this exhibition.

As Genii says in her book: "I would love to have known my grandfather. In lieu of that, I want nothing so much as for others to know about him and enjoy his masterful paintings." We hope you'll enjoy them, too.
